


- How has our school/district changed over time?

### **CAASPP Scale Score Bands**




Maintaining the same performance level requires **different amounts of growth** depending on the grade level transition.

For example, "Met" jumps +49 in Math from 3rd to 4th grade but only +15 from 6th to 7th grade.




